Section 4. First aid measures

Eye contact: Rinse thoroughly with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes and consult a physician.

Section 5. Firefighting measures

Flammability of the product: Combustible at high temperature.

Limited evidence of carcinogenicity in animal studies. IARC: 3 Group 3: Not classifiable as to its carcinogenicity to humans (Hydroquinone).
- **Mutagenic effects:** Laboratory experiments have shown mutagenic effects. In vitro tests showed mutagenic effects. Genotoxicity in vivo Rat Oral negative. Genotoxicity in vivo Mouse Intraperitoneal positive.
- Teratogenic effects: No data available.
- Medical conditions aggravated by overexposure: Absorption into the body leads to the formation of methemoglobin which in sufficient concentration causes cyanosis. Onset may be delayed 2 to 4 hours or longer.
